

**SANTA ROSA VALLEY MUNICIPAL ADVISORY COUNCIL MINUTES**  
**March 17, 2011**

**The Santa Rosa Valley MAC held a Meeting on Thursday, March 17, 2011  
at 6:00 p.m. at the Rancho Santa Rosa Property Owners' Association Club House,  
11701 East Las Posas Road, Camarillo, CA 93012**

**1. Call to Order**

**Rosemary Allison** called the meeting to order at 6:08 p.m. MAC members Don Shubert, Ruth Means and Mark Burley were present. MAC member Janis Gardner was absent.

**2. Pledge of Allegiance**

**Janet Wall** led the Pledge of Allegiance.

**3. Agenda Review**

No changes were made to the agenda.

**4. Approval of Minutes**

Rosemary Allison moved to approve the February 10, 2011 minutes as submitted. Mark Burley made the second. Motion passed 3/0 (Don Shubert abstained).

**5. Comments of Ventura County Supervisor Linda Parks**

In **Supervisor Parks'** absence, **Janet Wall** told the MAC that Supervisor Parks is meeting with the Chair of the Ventura County Emergency Planning Council, the Fire Chief, Sheriff, and all emergency heads of the county to discuss local tsunami damage, health care issues, radiation potential and health impacts from radiation. Supervisor Parks warns residents that taking potassium iodide could cause serious health problems and that it is strongly discouraged by the California Department of Public Health. Janet Wall also told the MAC that the County is looking at the expected cutbacks from the State, in particular the release of prisoners. In conjunction with less funding to the Sheriff's Department, Sheriff Dean is examining re-entry programs, work furlough programs and other less costly ways of dealing with prisoner releases. She added that County budget preparations are underway, and that Marty Robinson, CEO, is retiring on March 22, 2011, with the new CEO being sworn in at the April 5, 2011 Board of Supervisor's meeting. Janet Wall brought a recent statement of Supervisor Parks on library funding. In addition, Janet told the MAC that flyers are available which highlight a new Pharmaceutical Waste Disposal Site where residents are able to safely and confidentially dispose of old and unwanted pharmaceutical waste in a special collection container located in the lobby of the Thousand Oaks Police Department at 2101 E. Olsen Road. Drop-offs can be made during normal business hours, 8 a.m.-5 p.m. In closing, Janet said that written information is also provided from David Fleisch on the issue of CHP enforcement on private roads.

**6. Public Comments**

**CHP Officer Randy Hosking** told the MAC that accident statistics in the Santa Rosa Valley area show 4 collisions occurred from January to March 2011. From January to December 2010, there were 43 collisions, and 17 were injury accidents. In 2009, 38 collisions occurred, and 13 were injury accidents. Enforcement statistics showed that from January 2009 to March 2011, 379 citations were issued on westbound Santa Rosa Road and 351 citations on eastbound Santa Rosa Road. In the same time period, 94 citations were issued on East Las Posas and 138 citations on Moorpark Road from Tierra Rejada to Santa Rosa Road. The MAC thanked Officer Hosking for providing the report.

**Jim Fortney** said that an open ham radio meeting of the Santa Rosa Valley Emergency Radio Network will be conducted on March 29, 2011 at 7:00 p.m. at the Rancho Santa Rosa Property Owners Clubhouse. Jim said he will be bringing a few pieces of equipment to display.

## **7. Council Comments on Issues Not on the Agenda**

**Rosemary Allison** told the MAC that a fundraiser to benefit Santa Rosa Technology Magnet School will be held on April 2, 2011. She said that Pleasant Valley School District is taking a \$10M cut in income next year. In addition, Rosemary said that Kimme Black is sponsoring a family picnic and hoe down fundraiser called "There's No Place Like Hope" on Sunday, May 22, 2011 from 11 a.m. to 4 p.m. in the Bridlewood Arena Park to benefit the California Coastal Horse Rescue.

In addition, Rosemary Allison said she will not be available for the April 21 MAC meeting. After discussion, the MAC voted 4/0 to cancel the April 21 meeting and schedule a special meeting on Thursday, April 7.

## **8. Information Items**

### **a. CERT Trailer Update**

**Janet Wall** told the MAC that the trailer is out for bid and that the delivery date may be available at the next meeting. **Rosemary Allison** said that she has paid for a website for the CERT and she is requesting residents to input emergency information. **Mark Burley, Jim Fortney** and **Gusie Woodfill** said they participated in the Formidable Footprint Workshop and that the CERT should schedule a yearly meeting to discuss emergency plans using the outline of the workshop as a guideline. Jim Fortney said he can utilize the Verizon Emergency Operation Center in Camarillo for training purposes.

### **b. Moorpark Vineyard Church at Santa Rosa/Moorpark Intersection**

**Janet Wall** told the MAC that the Thousand Oaks planner did not provide an update this month. She said Supervisor Parks office will continue to request updates.

### **c. Las Posas Equestrian Bridge over the Arroyo Update**

**Mark Burley** said the conditions from Watershed Protection District were received today. He said he and the engineer will meet with WPD to supply the construction schedule. Mark told the MAC that the work cannot start until the end of the rainy season and until the bond is posted, probably around April 30.

### **d. Graffiti Removal Intervention Team Update (GRIT)**

**Kevin Cannon and Mark Burley** reported that a small amount of graffiti around the Camelot area was reported and that team members received their individual Encroachment Permits from WPD.

### **e. April 30, 2011 Helping Hands Volunteer Event at Santa Rosa Park**

**Janet Wall** told the MAC that a small volunteer project is planned for Saturday, April 30 to plant 40 replacement trees and to spread mulch around the planting areas. Representatives of the Church of Latter Day Saints expect to supply 15-20 volunteers for the 4-hour project from 8 a.m. to noon.

## **9. Action Items**

### **a. Santa Rosa Equestrian Park Update**

**Rosemary Allison** said that a meeting with Councilman Gillette and Scott Mitnick was canceled and that a secretary at the city left a message saying the City Council vote will not take place on March 22. Rosemary will provide an update at the next MAC meeting.

### **b. Windmill**

**Mark Burley** said that a windmill is available from a community member which could be installed at Santa Rosa Equestrian Park or perhaps at McCrea Ranch if they are interested. Janet Wall said she will ask the Parks Department for their input and report at the next meeting.
