

SANTA ROSA VALLEY MUNICIPAL ADVISORY COUNCIL MINUTES
October 17, 2013

**The Santa Rosa Valley MAC held a Meeting on Thursday, October 17, 2013
at 6:00 p.m. at the Rancho Santa Rosa Property Owners' Association Club House,
11701 East Las Posas Road, Camarillo, CA 93012**

1. Call to Order

Rosemary Allison called the meeting to order at 6:06 p.m. **Mark Burley** and **Janis Gardner** were present. **Kevin Cannon** and **Ruth Means** were absent.

2. Pledge of Allegiance

Rosemary Allison led the Pledge of Allegiance.

3. Agenda Review

No changes were made to the Agenda.

4. Public Safety Reports

Senior Deputy Matt Volpe said there have been tool and farm equipment thefts as well as thieves stealing car parts including 3rd row seats of suburban Tahoes and Cadillac SUVs as well as GPS systems and driver and passenger mirrors. He advised that residents keep their cars in their garages or backup to a wall to keep rear seats from being stolen from the back of vehicles. **CHP Officer Mike Moriarty** reported there were three minor collisions. He requested notification of the next Santa Rosa Road volunteer cleanup efforts so he can assist with additional patrol units. He anticipates having the radar trailer in Santa Rosa Valley in the next few weeks. A discussion ensued regarding a rear-end collision on eastbound Santa Rosa Road at Yucca Drive. **Jim Fortney** expressed concern about drivers passing on the right in the acceleration lane at Hill Canyon Road.

5. Approval of Minutes

Janis Gardner moved to approve the July 18, 2013 minutes, **Mark Burley** made the second. Motion passed 3/0.

6. Comments of Ventura County Supervisor Linda Parks

Supervisor Parks provided follow up from the Transportation Department regarding type of slurry seal on Redondo Avenue. **Mark Burley** asked that we share with Transportation Department reports of horses slipping on new pavement on East Las Posas. **Supervisor Parks** agreed to inform the Department Director, **David Fleisch**. She also commented on the desire of Lynn Ranch Property Owners Association to have a functional equestrian trail from Lynn Ranch through the barranca to Hill Canyon and Santa Rosa Valley Park. It was suggested interested Lynn Ranch residents attend a COSTAC meeting to learn how to get involved in trail planning and maintenance. Finally, **Supervisor Parks** informed the MAC that a mail thief had been caught in Somis and may have been connected with recent thefts in Santa Rosa Valley.

7. Public Comments on Items Not on the Agenda

Gusie Woodfill reported on dumping of debris in a ditch along the Arroyo Santa Rosa, next to Tropical Paradise. **Supervisor Parks** said she would follow up.

8. Council Comments on Issues Not on the Agenda

There were no Council comments.

9. Information Items

a. Santa Rosa Valley Equestrian Park

Mark Burley requested that a free parking sign be added to the kiosk so people coming to the park aren't discouraged from parking in the parking lot when they see the kiosk. He also asked if a faucet

could be located closer to the parking lot as he saw an equestrian hauling a bucket of water from the bathroom to her horse tied to her trailer in the parking lot. Supervisor Parks said she would follow up.

b. Graffiti Removal Intervention Team (GRIT)

Jim Fortney said there is a small area of graffiti on the backside of the Rancho Santa Rosa Property Owners' Association Club House wall, though it may be the POA's responsibility.

10. Action Items

a. Santa Rosa Valley Trail Plan

Mark Burley updated the MAC on the Santa Rosa Valley Trails, Inc.'s efforts to add the Santa Rosa Valley trail plan to the County General Plan. He reported that Rincon Consulting is doing an on-site inspection of all trails and meeting with him, and will report to the Board of Supervisors on how the Plan should be designed. Once approved by the Board it will go through hearings for a General Plan Amendment (GPA). He said the MAC is requested to hold a public forum to get community input for the consultant. Mark Burley made a motion to have the MAC hold the forum. **Janis Gardner** seconded the motion and it passed 3-0. The MAC asked that the item be agendaized for the meeting of November 21st and have the Trail Plan forum placed on the agenda before Tropical Paradise's CUP.
