The Department is unable to comment on these findings not because they are not accurate or because the Department does not agree, but rather because they cover areas of fact finding unrelated to the Behavioral Health Department's own scope of fact verification.

Recommendations:

R3: Parenting and counseling classes should be provided for parents of truant children and an accessible mental health system should be created to provide services to truant youth.

The Behavioral Health Department concurs with this recommendation and believes that it will require further study as to program development, target population, resource availability, and implementation. There are current programs for counseling and parenting classes throughout Ventura County, not only through Behavioral Health, but also through many Community Partner organizations. Perhaps the JJCC can continue discussions on the quantification of need and the development of services to meet those needs.
