VENTURA COUNTY GRAND JURY

FINDINGS:

• The City of Thousand Oaks agrees with the findings numbered FI-01, FI-02 and FI-04.

FI-01. All places of incarceration in the County meet the minimum standards of CSA for the areas reviewed. (FA-01)

FI-02. Holding facilities and jails in the County are doing a satisfactory job holding, pre-booking or booking, and incarcerating juveniles. Both Ojai and Camarillo facilities have innovative programs dealing with juveniles.

FI-04. All facilities are prepared for natural disasters and medical incidents. (FA-01,07)

RECOMMENDATIONS:

 Recommendation numbered R-05 is currently offered by the Thousand Oaks Police Department.

R-05. That cities without parenting programs for juveniles review and implement innovative programs such as those of Camarillo and Ojai.

City Response - The parenting classes mentioned in the Grand Jury report are currently offered in Thousand Oaks. The Thousand Oaks police department is currently offering Parent Project classes which provide guidance, instruction, and information to assist parents in dealing with difficult, strong willed or defiant children.
