#### **GRAND JURY REPORT RESPONSE**

#### **Campaign Contributions Transparency**

The County welcomes the Grand Jury's continued participation in and oversight of the elections process. We share the common goal of ensuring an open, transparent and fair election process for all voters and office candidates of Ventura County. The Board of Supervisors would, however, recommend the Grand Jury consider having the County Clerk and Recorder respond to this Grand Jury Report. The Clerk and Recorder, an independently elected official, per the County's Campaign Finance Reform Ordinance (Div. 1, Ch. 2, Art. 6 of Ventura County Ordinance Code), is responsible for receiving the mandated electronic filings for the County and therefore is also responsible for selecting, operating and maintaining the County's Campaign Financial Contributions reporting system. Although the Board of Supervisors is providing this response as required, the County Clerk and Recorder is the more appropriate party to respond to this Grand Jury report. The Board's response is not on his behalf.

#### **Grand Jury Conclusions**

C-01. The County's website only provides access to transactions from electronically filed documents. However, the website is overly complicated, not intuitive, and may require the assistance of county staff in its navigation. Access to records of non-electronically filed monetary contributions requires a visit to the Registrar of Voters Office. (FA-01)

#### **RESPONSE:**

We partially disagree with this conclusion.

It is correct that 1) a portion of campaign finance reports are available online through the Registrar of Voters E-Filing System while other campaign finance reports are currently available only in paper format at the Registrar of Voters Office, and 2) navigation and labeling on both the County and Clerk and Recorder websites, combined with the large number of different office filings, search, and data download options associated the contribution reporting web site make it more complicated compared to smaller local city sites, but not necessarily "overly" complex.

The Ventura County Campaign Finance Reform Ordinance mandates e-filing (electronic filing) only for County of Ventura candidates and independent expenditure committees. Candidates running for other offices (such as school districts or special districts) may file electronically by utilizing the Clerk and Recorder's E-Filing System, and many do; however, the County's Campaign Finance Reform Ordinance does not mandate that the campaign finance reports for these other offices be filed electronically. Approximately 300 office holders and candidates are required to file campaign finance reports on an annual, quarterly, or more frequent basis depending on their contributions and expenditures. Most of these campaign finance reports are filed with the Registrar of Voters in a paper format and are not displayed in the Clerk and Recorder's on-line system.

We partially disagree that the Clerk and Recorder's E-Filing System website is overly complicated. We agree that navigation to the site from the main County website, previous to the County adding a link on it's main website as recommended by the Grand jury, was not as straightforward as possible. An inquirer would have to know the County organizational structure and individual agency roles in order to know to go the County Clerk and Recorder's website to find the campaign finance reports. Additionally, once on the Clerk and Recorder's website, the labeling of the link

to the campaign finance reporting site can be more intuitive to the layperson, as opposed to the current "Campaign Finance e-file system".

With regard to the complexity of the system, compared to local cities where, when available, a requestor need only navigate and search a small number (typically 5) of city council office filings, we agree the County Clerk and Recorder's system is more complex. This is due to the large number of filing offices and the multiple options available for searching these large number of filings. For example, the Clerk and Recorder's site allows an individual to:

- Download an Excel spreadsheet of the filings.
- Search By Name
- Search by Filer ID
- · Search by Filing Date
- Search by Independent Expenditure
- Browse all filings by election date, office and candidate name

The availability of these multiple search options, while both beneficial and desirable to certain requestors and common for large County campaign finance reporting sites, (the County's system is the same system utilized by more than 20 large California counties), can make simple searches by inexperienced or infrequent inquirers complex and difficult.

As noted in the response to recommendation R-01 below, the County Executive Office has had a link added to the County's main website to make navigation to the campaign contribution finance reporting site more straightforward. Additionally, while options may be somewhat limited given a vendor software package is utilized that is also used by a large number of counties and cities throughout the state, it would certainly be beneficial for the County Clerk and Recorder's office to explore options with the software vendor for simplifying access to the information.

C-04. If the format of online information was consistent, the citizens of the County would be able to easily compare records of monetary contributions made to candidates for public office. The City of Simi Valley has the most user friendly format regarding monetary contributions online. (FA-09)

#### **RESPONSE:**

We partially disagree with the conclusion. We agree there are opportunities to simplify and improve the navigation and overall experience of the County Clerk and Recorder's campaign finance reporting site. However, once located, the report formats themselves at both our local cities and the County are already very similar in that both are essential on-line versions of state forms. Additionally, while navigational improvements and search simplification would be beneficial, duplicating the navigation and single display options of local cities, with their limited number of offices may not be practical or desirable. As previously noted, the Ventura County Campaign Finance Reform Ordinance mandates e-filing of campaign contribution reports for a relatively large number of County of Ventura offices, candidates and independent expenditure committees, in addition to allowing for the electronic filing of other offices on a discretionary basis.
