Responses

Conclusion C-07: The Grand Jury concluded body cameras have become a law enforcement best practice. The Simi Valley Police Department is the only city law enforcement agency in the County not using body cameras.

Response to C-07: The City of Simi Valley does not contest the Grand Jury's Conclusion C-07. Please refer to the response to Recommendation R-07.

Recommendation R-07: The Grand Jury recommends the Simi Valley City Council follow best practice and approve funds to implement a body camera program for sworn officers.

Response to R-07: The City of Simi Valley is currently evaluating the implementation of body cameras. Due to budget constraints, however, the costs associated with such a program are prohibitive. While grants are available to cover the initial start-up costs, the projected impact to the City's budget would be \$1.7 million over a five year period. This cost includes the implementation of a program with 125 cameras and the addition of a full-time staff member to handle the data storage, Public Records Act requests, and requests for discovery from both the District Attorney's and Public Defender's Offices.
